BFA REVIEW

READ THESE INSTRUCTIONS CAREFULLY

These instructions, as well as a Q&A Discussion Group, can be found on the BFA Review Blackboard page. Find it under Blackboard > Home > scroll down to My Organizations

- The BFA Portfolio Review is required for students who have completed the Art Foundation Courses and who are applying to continue in a BFA program in Studio Art, Photography, Computer Animation, or Graphic Design. Students MUST sign up for the BFA review the semester after they have successfully completed (grade of C or better) the following classes.
- ARTS 1313, 1314, & 1315 WASH
- ARTS 1316 Drawing
- ARTS 2313 Foundations in Digital Art

Eligibility

- Students must take the BFA Review the first full semester after successfully completing the courses listed above, with a grade of C or above.
- Students who pass the review will sign a BFA declaration and may pursue a BFA Degree in Computer Animation, Studio Art, or Photography. Students who do not pass will sign a BA declaration.
- After passing the BFA Portfolio Review, Graphic Design majors must pass an additional Graphic Design Portfolio Review after taking Typography (ARTS 3322).
- The BFA Review may be repeated one time the following semester only. Students who do not pass the second time may pursue a BA in Art or a major in another department.
- Students will receive scores that indicate areas for improvement.

READ THESE INSTRUCTIONS CAREFULLY

STEP 1: CHOOSE ARTWORK

Work from WASH, Drawing, and Foundations in Digital Art may be included in the portfolio. Work from other classes in the Art Core (Ceramics, Life Drawing 1 & 2, Performance and Video Art, Painting, Photographic Concepts, Printmaking, Sculpture) or Animation or Graphic Design may be used if these classes have been taken. Work created outside of class may be included.

Students should choose their best works that meet the criteria on the Checklist. Do not submit extra work.

All works in the portfolio must be non-collaborative and the student should be the sole author. All works should be original in nature, no copies of existing works or works produced from tutorials.

No work utilizing AI image, video, or animation generators may be submitted for the BFA Review. AI generated work is considered plagiarism and will be reviewed as such.

Plagiarism: If it is discovered that a BFA Review Portfolio contains work that has been created by anyone other than the student submitting the portfolio, the student will fail the BFA Review and not be allowed to repeat it. The student submitting the portfolio and any student who provided the plagiarized work will be referred the Dean of Students for further disciplinary action.

DO NOT SUBMIT EXTRA WORK.

Submit only the number of works listed in the checklist. Your work for each section will be evaluated as a whole. For example, in the drawing section, all of your drawings do not have to fulfill every one of the criteria, but you must demonstrate each criteria in at least one drawing. You may have one work that demonstrates your ability to use perspective, and another that shows your ability to use value and another that shows your ability to communicate a concept.

Craftsmanship will be considered in each work.

You will be evaluated on your presentation. This will include, but is not limited to, correct labeling of work (labels will be provided on day of installation), neatness of display, and following provided instructions.

STEP 2: GET ADVICE FROM FACULTY

It is important to submit your best work in each category. Students are strongly encouraged to make an appointment to meet with a faculty member, show them your work, and seek their advice.

STEP 3: INSTALLATION OF ARTWORK

Installation will take place according to date and time listed on accompanying calendar.

Labels for your work will be provided at check-in when you set up your work.

Students are responsible for the installation of their work for the review. Students may bring assistants to help them with large work if necessary, but each student in the review is responsible for all decisions and choices made regarding the installation of the work. Students may not have friends or family members install their work. Any person assisting with installation must be 18 years old or older.

Materials that will be provided

- Tools (ladders, levels, drills, tape measures, and hammers)
- Labels for your work
- Pedestals until they run out. You are not allowed more than one pedestal of those provided. You are welcome to bring in your own small tables/pedestals, as long as they fit within your chosen location.

Do NOT use glue, velcro, double-sided tape, or staples on walls.

Come prepared. You will need to provide your own tacks, nails, screws, hooks, wire and anything else needed to professionally install your work.

Do NOT submit work having wet paint.

Adhere to ALL of guidelines for submitting ALL work (follow the requirements!)

DO NOT SUBMIT EXTRA WORK.

Follow instructions for submitting digital files.

DRAWING CATEGORY

Artwork for the DRAWING category must be installed. No digital submissions are allowed for this category.

SURFACE CATEGORY

Artwork for the SURFACE category must be installed. No digital submissions are allowed for this category.

SPACE CATEGORY

Artwork for the SPACE category must be installed. No digital submissions are allowed for this category.

Work should be presented in the form in which it was originally created. If for some reason it is not possible to physically present the three-dimensional piece, a series of images may be submitted that clearly represents the artwork. However, the original work is always preferred.

If you have ephemeral or site-specific work to submit as 3D work, seek guidance from a professor in the 3D area on how to represent the piece in the BFA Review.

DIGITAL CATEGORY

Artwork for this category may be printed and displayed in your space, or submitted via the BFA Review Blackboard page.

Whether printed or submitted digitally, Source Files must be submitted via Blackboard.

Printed & Displayed

Print your file and display in your review space along with other work. Submit Source File(s) via Blackboard.

Image Files:

Submit as JPG via Blackboard along with your Source File(s) You must submit the file as a JPG as well as submitting your Source File.

Animated GIFs

Animated GIF files are acceptable to include in your BFA Review materials. Submit via Blackboard along with your Source File(s).

Video Files

Students submitting video are strongly encouraged to seek assistance from faculty regarding which category is appropriate for the video. MOV or MP4 files should be compressed using the H.264 codec. Movies should be no longer than 2 minutes. Longer movies should be edited down to clips of 2 minutes or less.

If you are intending on submitting a video, please consider using a video streaming service or cloud storage to submit. For video streaming, only use YouTube or Vimeo. Cloud storage options include Google Drive, One Drive, and Dropbox. We will not be able to provide instructions on using these methods for submitting videos, so if you are not already familiar with the process, then you should submit your files directly to Blackboard.

If using a video streaming service (YouTube or Vimeo), make sure that it can be viewed by the general public. Do not password protect the video. It is recommended that you have a family member or friend test the web link you have provided in your image list to make sure that it works.

If using cloud storage (Google Drive, One Drive, Dropbox, etc), make sure that file has public sharing permissions. Private files can not be viewed by the faculty reviewing your work. It is recommended that you have a family member or friend test the web link you have provided in your image list to make sure that it works

Regardless of how you submit your video, your Source File(s) must be submitted via Blackboard.

SOURCE FILES

All image submissions in this category must include source files.

<u>Images:</u> Source files must be the original file created when completing the piece. Files may be psd, tiff, png, and/or ai formats. Your layers must be intact (not flattened.) No other file format will be accepted. If built in a different application, export as one of the file formats listed above.

Videos:

Students should be prepared to submit project assets if necessary to prove authorship. Do not submit assets unless requested.

If you have any questions about how to submit your source files, contact one of the professors listed for guidance. Contact them by the deadline shown on the Calendar.

STEP 4: DE-INSTALLATION OF ARTWORK

Work MUST be removed by date and time listed on accompanying calendar.

Students are responsible for the de-installation of their work after the review has taken place. Students unable to be present on the scheduled day and times for de-installation must make arrangements to have a friend or family member remove the work from the location where you installed your work.

FAILURE TO REMOVE WORK ON THE SCHEDULED DAY AND TIME WILL RESULT IN AN AUTOMATIC "NO PASS" REGARDLESS OF SCORE.

STEP 5: RECEIVE RESULTS

Students will pick up their BFA Review results in the Art Office. See accompanying calendar for date.

Students who pass the review will sign a BFA declaration and may pursue a BFA Degree in Computer Animation, Studio Art, or Photography. Students who do not pass will sign a BA declaration.

The BFA Review may be repeated one time the following semester only. Students who do not pass the second time may pursue a BA in Art or a major in another department.

After passing the BFA Portfolio Review, Graphic Design majors must pass an additional Graphic Design Portfolio Review after taking Typography (ARTS 3322).

Students will receive scores that indicate areas for improvement.

- Students should choose their best works that meet the criteria on the Checklist. Do not submit extra work.
- Students are encouraged to meet with a faculty member for assistance in selecting work the semester before they sign up for the BFA review.

Eligibility

- All students who have successfully completed the foundation courses listed above, with a grade of C or above, must take the BFA review.
- Students who pass the review will sign a BFA declaration and may pursue a BFA Degree in Computer Animation, Studio Art, or Photography. Students who do not pass will sign a BA declaration.
- The BFA Review may be repeated one time the following semester only. Students who do not pass the second time may pursue a BA in Art or a major in another department.
- After passing the BFA Portfolio Review, Graphic Design majors must pass an additional Graphic Design Portfolio Review after taking Typography (ARTS 3322).
- Students will receive scores that indicate areas for improvement.
- Students are encouraged to seek mentoring from faculty if they receive a negative result.
- All work will be submitted digitally. You will need to photograph each of your submitted pieces.

- Students have access to a photography studio in room 403 in the Art Building to document work.
- To use the studio, students should make an appointment with a Photo Studio Lab Technician. The technician will provide access to the room and can assist students with lighting. To make an appointment, email shsuPhotoLabMonitor@gmail.com or go to room 418 to schedule an appointment or walk-in during lab tech hours.

Correctly naming your files is *extremely important*. Follow this naming format. 3D works may include detail images.

Create an Image List. This can be done in any program, such as MS Word. This list will include the size and medium of each piece. Size indicates the dimensions of the artwork, NOT including any mats or frames.

Once you have all your images ready and correctly titled, you will create a PDF Portfolio in Adobe Acrobat Pro. If you do not have access to Adobe Acrobat Pro (it is part of the Adobe Creative Cloud), you may create a PDF from a Word document Detailed instructions on creating a PDF Portfolio and a Word PDF are included below.

Plagiarism:

If it is discovered that a BFA Review Portfolio contains work that has been created by anyone other than the student submitting the portfolio, the student will fail the BFA Review and not be allowed to repeat it. The student submitting the Portfolio and any student who provided the plagiarized work will be referred the Dean of Students for further disciplinary action.

DO NOT SUBMIT EXTRA WORK.

Submit only the number of works listed in the checklist. Your work for each section will be evaluated as a whole. For example, in the drawing section, all of your drawings do not have to fulfill every one of the criteria, but you must demonstrate each criteria in at least one drawing. You may have one work that demonstrates your ability to use perspective, and another that shows your ability to use value and another that shows your ability to communicate a concept.

Craftsmanship will be considered in each work.

You will be evaluated on your presentation. For digital submission, this will include, but is not limited to, correct naming of files, correct image size, and following provided instructions.

It is important to submit your best work in each category. If you are unsure what to submit, make an appointment to meet with a faculty member and show them your work and seek their advice.

IMAGES

Images should be JPG formatted. See page titled **Image Size** for detailed instructions on file size and formats.

ANIMATED GIFs

Animated GIF files are acceptable to include in your BFA Review materials. If you have an animated GIF file, you will need to submit this separately. They will not work inside of a PDF file. If you will be submitting an animated GIF, please make note of this in your image list.

VIDEO FILES

Students submitting video are strongly encouraged to seek assistance from faculty regarding which category is appropriate for the video.

MOV or MP4 files should be compressed using the H.264 codec. Movies should be no longer than 2 minutes. Longer movies should be edited down to clips of 2 minutes or less.

If you are intending on submitting a video, please consider using a video streaming service or cloud storage to submit. For video streaming, only use YouTube or Vimeo. Cloud storage options include Google Drive, One Drive, and Dropbox. We will not be able to provide instructions on using these methods for submitting videos, so if you are not already familiar with the process, then you should submit your files directly to Blackboard.

If you will be submitting a video with a web link, you must include the link in your image list.

If using a video streaming service (YouTube or Vimeo), make sure that it can be viewed by the general public. Do not password protect the video. It is recommended that you have a family member or friend test the web link you have provided in your image list to make sure that it works.

If using cloud storage (Google Drive, One Drive, Dropbox, etc), make sure that file has public sharing permissions. Private files can not be viewed by the faculty reviewing your work. It is recommended that you have a family member or friend test the web link you have provided in your image list to make sure that it works

Image Size

Before creating your PDF file, be sure your images are the correct size. They should be **no larger than 1500 pixels on their longest side**.

They should be no smaller than 800 pixels on their longest side.

Below are instructions on how to resize images in either Photoshop or Preview.



In Photoshop

Open image

In the Menu at top, choose Image > Image Size

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In Dialog box, change from inches to Pixels.

Set the longest side, either Width or Height, to no larger than 1500 pixels, and no smaller than 800 pixels.

In Dialog Box, change from inches to pixels. Set the longest side, either Width or Height, to no larger than 1500 pixels, and no smaller than 800 pixels.

How to Create a PDF Portfolio in Acrobat



In Adobe Acrobat Pro

Choose one of these two ways to start your document.

File > Create > PDF Portfolio



or

From the Start Screen, choose Multiple Files and Create PDF Portfolio.



Drag your correctly named files into this window.



You can reorder files by dragging them around in this window. Make your first page your Image List.

When have all your files in this window, click Create.

Check that the file looks correct. You should see the file names along the side, and see the correct file name at the top of each image.



To save, choose File > PDF Portfolio.

Name the PDF with your name 'LastFirst' For Example SmithJohn. pdf

DIGITAL FILES

- If you have an animated file, you may submit this separately. These will not work inside of a PDF Portfolio file.
- Acceptable files formats are JPG and MOV or MP4 files. Other file types will not be accepted. MOV or MP4 files should be compressed using the H.264 codec. Movies should be no longer than 2 minutes. Longer movies should be edited down to clips of 2 minutes or less.
- These should still be titled digital_1 and/or digital_2

In MS Word

Create a new document.

On the first page, type your Image List. Do not include your name on this page.

On the next page, type "drawing_1" and place your first drawing.

Choose Insert > Break > Page Break. On this next page, type "drawing_2" and place your next drawing.

Continue until you have all of your images placed. You MUST have each image labeled with the correct file name.

To save as a PDF, go to File > Save As.

In the Save dialog box, at the bottom change the Format to PDF.

Open PDF and be sure it looks correct.

DIGITAL FILES

- If you have an animated file, you may submit this separately. These will not work inside of a PDF file.
- Acceptable files formats are JPG and MOV or MP4 files. Other file types will not be accepted. MOV or MP4 files should be compressed using the H.264 codec. Movies should be no longer than 2 minutes. Longer movies should be edited down to clips of 2 minutes or less.

These should still be titled digital_1 and/or digital_2

Submitting Artwork on Blackboard for BFA Review

STEP 1:

Create your PDF using the instructions above. Pay close attention to naming your files correctly. Don't forget to include the Image List.

STEP 2:

When ready to submit artwork for the BFA Review, log into SHSU Blackboard. Scroll to bottom of Home page. Under **My Organizations**, click on **BFA Review**. Click on the words **SUBMIT ARTWORK HERE** in the column on the left.

Click on the words CLICK HERE. Under ASSIGNMENT FILES, click on Attach Files > Browse My Computer.

Attach your PDF file.

If submitting separate MOV or MP4 files, attach those also. You will probably have to attach files one at a time.

Hit Submit when finished.

After submitting your PDF, you may see a preview that looks like this. Don't panic. That's ok. Once download, work will be able to be viewed as intended.



TIPS FOR SUCCESS:

- Have all files uploaded correctly by the deadline.
- DO NOT wait until the last minute to start uploading your files. You will not be able to load files after the deadline.
- BE SURE your files are created and label correctly. Follow instructions CAREFULLY.
