Methodological support is available for qualitative and quantitative approaches. We can help by discussing various aspects of a quantitative study, such as, suggesting or critiquing a research design, recommending an appropriate statistic to address a research question, assisting in the interpretation of the results of an analysis, or serving as a sounding board for research ideas.

The Research Center is housed on the third floor of the Garrett Teacher Education Center at Sam Houston State University. Staff are available to meet online or in-person.
