The U.S. Department of Education announced first-ever awards, totaling over \$18 million, for the **Augustus F. Hawkins Centers of Excellence Program** grants to increase high-quality teacher preparation programs for teachers of color, strengthen the diversity of our teacher pipeline, and address teacher shortages. **Sam Houston State University is proud to be one of only twelve institutions to receive the grant.** Grantees were selected based on their focus on key aspects of a high-quality teacher preparation pipeline, including evidence-based, comprehensive teacher preparation that emphasize classroom experience and mentorship. SHSU received an award of \$1,599,900.
